

Halliburton Company Presentation and YPs – 18.05.2016



On May 18th 2016 Halliburton came to Clausthal for a company presentation as well as a Young Professional presentation. The presentations began at 18:00 with a short introduction to the company given by Christian Kiesl, a Business Development Manager & Managing Director for Halliburton in Celle, the first presentation was followed by the “Young Professional Ambassador Program”. The presentations were attended by 42 members of the student chapter.

Mr. Kiesl’s presentation gave a quick introduction to Halliburton as a company, the size of the company and its employment worldwide as well as their vision for the future. He also gave a short presentation on the company history and important steps along the way, before moving on to the facilities in Celle. A short introduction of all the different product lines was followed by a quick description of the career process at Halliburton. He made mention that due to the current situation Halliburton is not recruiting but explained the process regardless.

The second presentation of the evening was given by three young professionals who graduated from the TU Clausthal recently. They gave a quick introduction on themselves and then talked about their specific

product lines and the experiences they had so far. The three presenters were Natalie Zamaro-Anders, Renke Petersen and Johannes Rinne all working for different product lines within Halliburton. Natalie presented first on Halliburton's cementing line which she specializes in. In addition to describing the normal workflow she talked about the work load and how scheduling works. Her presentation was followed by Johannes Rinne's presentation, he specializes in the Completion Tools line and actually brought a few sample tools with him. He brought a Lock Mandrel and a SSD with him and explained how they worked. The final component of the presentation was given by Renke Petersen on the Production Solution line. All three presenters gave quick overviews of their division and talked about their weekly and daily workloads and schedules. At the end of the presentation the floor was opened for questions from the audience. The audience was very interested in several topics and asked many questions regarding the schedules and where most of the work took place.

After the questions died down, dinner was provided for the group by Halliburton enabling a less formal exchange with the presenters and other students. The visitors left around 20:30 after a successful presentation.
